The City of San Jacinto is seeking qualified candidates for the position of Water Production Operator I to perform operates, maintains, installs services and performs operational repairs to facilities and equipment used in the storage, treatment and distribution of potable water, reclaimed water and waste water; follows a prescribed routine in reading and recording water meter readings; and to perform related duties as assigned.

Ideal Candidate will:

- Work independently, and part of a team.
- Be ethical, self-motivated, adaptable, organized and comfortable working in a team-oriented environment.
- Understand the principals, methods practices and techniques utilized in the chemical, bacteriological and biological analysis.
- Operate a variety of pumping, treatment, control and transmission equipment and machinery, including digital control equipment.
- Operate and maintain hand and power tools pertaining to the work.
- Accurately read meters, gauges, valve books, blueprints and schematic drawings.
- Operate electronic SCADA Systems.
- Make mathematical calculations.
- Exercise sound judgment in performing assignments.
- Follow oral and written instructions, including safety practices and procedures.
- Effectively and professionally communicate orally and in writing.
- Work quickly, efficiently, and calmly under stressful conditions.
- Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with the public and with co-workers.
- Stand in for Water Utilities Superintendent as needed.
- Lift up to 90 lbs.

Minimum Qualifications:

A typical way of obtaining the required qualifications is to possess the equivalent of:

Experience - Four years (4) experience in the maintenance of wells, treatment plants, water services, mains, meters, valves, hydrants and related facilities.

Licenses and Certificates – Possession of a Class “B” California Driver’s License with Tanker Endorsement.

Possession of a Water Treatment Operator Grade 1 certificate from the California Department of Public Health.

Possession of a Water Distribution Grade 2 certificate from the California Department of Public Health.

Education - High school diploma or equivalent.

Compensation and Benefits:

The starting salary will be commensurate with the experience, qualifications and skills of the successful candidate and within the range of \$48,578 to \$68,009 annually.

The City of San Jacinto also offers a competitive benefits package, including California Public Employees Retirement System pension, multiple HMO and PPO medical plan alternatives, dental, vision, life insurance, paid leave, commute incentives and continuing education.

About the City of San Jacinto:

Founded in 1870, and incorporated on April 9, 1888, San Jacinto is one of the County's oldest communities with roots that stretch back to the earliest days of California. The current population is just under 48,000 in San Jacinto's 26 square miles, with an average population age of 31.6 years old.

San Jacinto is experiencing a revitalization in a variety of development projects, road and drainage improvements, and is growing at its fastest pace in well over 10 years. The community is excited about the new economic development inside the City spurred by the development of the new 480,000 square foot Soboba Casino Resort, new retail establishments (Aldi Grocery, Starbucks Drive Thru, Wienerschnitzel Restaurant and Sonic Drive In, among others to come) and over 200 new homes permitted this calendar year.
