Larry Cutting will present the November program about his 23 years with the Rescue Task Force. Larry was born in San Jacinto and graduated from San Jacinto High School. He is a Vietnam era veteran. Larry has lived and worked the majority of his life internationally beginning in 1968 with an assignment to Germany. He has been extremely active in humanitarian work around the world beginning with an orphanage in the Philippines in the 1970's. He now works with the homeless and less fortunate in the San Jacinto Valley. Larry began his career working in the South Pacific Island of the Republic of Kribati. In 1974 he began a long-term involvement with projects and companies in the Mid-East, mainly Saudi Arabia. He presently serves on the Board of Directors of World Emergency Relief and also on the Board of Directors of A Child's Hope Fund. They provide emergency relief around the world. Rescue Task Force is a non-profit organization to provide volunteer medical teams, medial supplies, clinics and humanitarian aid to remote and isolated regions of the world. Larry will introduce Gary Becks, President and Founder of Rescue Task Force. He will then be the principal speaker. Larry will also introduce Bob and Beth Ferguson. They performed a "wheelchairs and shoes" mission in El Salvador on behalf of Rescue Task Force. Bob is the former minister of the San Jacinto Methodist Church.

Nancy will call others to fill in the missing dishes to make this a complete feast. Dinner will begin at 6 pm at the museum and the program will begin at 7 pm.
